Engineering Report

The people of the engineering committee have been very busy this month. On September 19th or 20th it was noticed the 146.805 and 444.950 repeaters were off the air. Bud Blust - WA5QDZ went to the site on the top floor of the Autumn Oaks Building about 71st and Yale to check what had happened. He found the repeaters had been unplugged again; but, this time there was a note saying who to contact and that they wanted to know who we were. Bud contacted me and I sent an email to Mark Thrash - WB5MBK (146.805 site chairman), Mike Reynolds - W0KIE, Tom Shaw - K5OVT, Brad Smith - W5BS and Bud - WA5QDZ letting them know the status of the repeater and we needed to find out what is going on. Mike - W0KIE having had an office in that building started

trying to find out. In the meantime Mark Conklin - N7XYO had received a phone call from a person, who wishes to remain anonymous, that he had word the equipment was going to be taken out of the building and off the roof and thrown away in a week or so and relayed that to me. Mike - W0KIE checked with people he knew that are still in the building; and, to get to the story before it gets too long, found out the





maintenance personnel did not know anything about the equipment being TRO's. What they wanted was the antennas on the roof straightened up. We had a bent mast on one of the antennas. Keep in mind, we had antennas up there for 70cm, 2M, 10M and 6M. Well there is a problem with the remote bases so Bud - WA5QDZ, Mike - W0KIE and Tom - K5OVT put a plan together to clean off all the roof mounts and antennas. Upon everyone working on the project agreeing with a plan proposed by Tom, Tom - K5OVT ordered a new dual band Diamond X50NA and a duplexer - the Diamond MX72N - to be used for the 444.950 repeater and the 146.205 receive for the 146.805 repeater. The separate transmit antenna for 146.805 was left in place. Mike - W0KIE was able to secure our staying on the Autumn Oaks Building for a while longer. Our equipment identification has been replaced with contact information and all is well. Mark - WB5MBK said he will be replacing the feedline to the transmit antenna in the very near future.

I want to thank everyone so much for stepping up and taking care of this. I was on vacation on the other side of the world and Mark - WB5MBK was out of town for his work and Bud, Tom and Mike stepped in, not only save our site, but, fixed it all too.

The 146.805 wasn't enough to round out the last month though. I received an email from Tim Deihl - KB5ZVC on October 10th saying that Rex Gotcher wanted me to call him. Our repeater equipment needed to be moved to a different floor. Well, I had no idea who Rex Gotcher is, so, I called the number first chance I had after returning to Tulsa. I learned that CityPlex wants us to move the 146.880 repeater equipment from the 59th floor to the 60th floor and within the next three weeks. Ben


Joplin - WB5VST has volunteered to meet with Rex during regular business hours to see where they are requesting we move the equipment and check our possibilities to continue to have our phone line to the repeater, electrical connections and how they wish the feedlines to be installed, etc., etc. My hope is to have this move completed by the end of October. The move of the equipment must be in the next week or two though. I may be calling for help.

Now, I'm not finished yet. Mark Conklin - N7XYO informed me that the Mid-Continent Building sale has closed so there are new owners there. I request anyone with any documentation of an agreement with the previous owners and the Tulsa Repeater Organization to please make a copy available to myself and our secretary, Ed Compos - K5CRQ.

Joe Gorkos - N5TEX is working on a plan for needed equipment, access and cost of installing the 146.94 repeater on the Childer's Tower at highway 412 and 209th West Avenue. This may come about and then it may not; but, we need the documentation no matter where 146.94 finally resides.

I can't say "thanks" enough. You are a great group of people.

**HELP NEEDED MOVING 88**


